





Welcome address

am delighted to welcome all participants to the 2025 Lagos Metropolitan Area Transport Authority (LAMATA) International Conference on Sustainable Urban Mobility (SUMConference25), holding at the Balmoral Convention Center, Sheraton Hotel & Towers, Ikeja-Lagos, Nigeria from October 8-10, 2025. LAMATA is an internationally certified (ISO) Lagos State Government (LASG) institution responsible for planning, implementing, franchising and regulating a sustainable integrated multimodal public transport system in the megacity of Lagos.

The journey actually began with our collaboration with Ochenuel Mobility Nigeria - organizers of the Africa Sustainable Mobility Course (SUMCourse), and other sustainable development partners in 2022 and 2023 when LAMATA hosted two successive SUMCourse workshops. The main objective of SUMCourse workshops were to continue building institutional and organizational capacity of the different executing LASG ministries, departments, agencies (MDAs), local governments, and coordinate their activities towards achieving a common and consistent policy basis for sustainable transport development in Lagos.

Subsequently, LAMATA transitioned from organizing capacity building SUMCourse workshops mainly for LASG MDAs to institutionalizing an annual national conference on sustainable urban mobility (SUMConference), in partnership with sustainable development partners, to serve as a knowledge hub for policy makers, planners, engineers, researchers, operators and other key stakeholders at both national and sub-national levels in Nigeria. In 2024, LASG through LAMATA formally institutionalized an annual conference on sustainable urban mobility.

The 2024 maiden edition of the LAMATA National Conference on Sustainable Urban Mobility (SUMConference24), held from August 24-25 at Eko Hotels & Suites, Victoria

Island-Lagos, received glowing reviews from participant stakeholders who attended the event. The 2024 maiden edition theme was "Implementing Safe, Inclusive and Climate Resilient Urban Transport in a Digital Age for Sustainable Development".

Institutionalization of the LAMATA annual conference on sustainable urban mobility aligns with the declared United Nations (UN) Decade of Sustainable Transport (2026-2035), which is a global initiative by the UN General Assembly to accelerate the development of sustainable, safe and inclusive transport systems to achieve Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The UN Decade Implementation Plan to be launched in December 2025, will outline strategies to address issues like rising greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, urban congestion, road safety and unequal access to

mobility. The initiative promotes coordinated actions and partnerships among governments, UN agencies, civil society and the private sector to implement equitable, energy-efficient, and climate-friendly transport systems.

LAMATA henceforth made a milestone decision from 2025 onwards to incorporate international stakeholder participation, especially from Africa into the SUMConference framework. This is geared towards fostering synergy, cooperation, commitment and unity among African governments, businesses and communities to adopt sustainable transport practices, reduce carbon footprints and promote renewable energy sources.

The theme for the 2025 International Conference on Sustainable Urban Mobility is: "Harnessing Clean Urban Transport Innovation and Investment in Africa".

The objectives of SUMConference 25 are as follows:

- (i) To provide a quintessential forum for key stakeholders from government, private sector, academia, NGOs, civil society, transport unions, public transport user groups, etc., to develop capacity on sustainable urban mobility.
- (ii) To create an avenue for highlighting critical issues in the transport sector such as Climate change, Investment, Innovation & Technology.
- (iii) To drive innovation in clean and smart urban transport for efficiency, sustainability and accessibility.
- (iv) To demonstrate the impact of innovative low-cost sensors in improving urban air quality monitoring and supporting sustainable transport solutions.
- (v) To evaluate African carbon market opportunities and climate-resilient bankable projects, including pivotal role of the private sector.
- (vi) To provide a platform for practical showcase of African urban mobility success stories thereby inspiring action by others.
- (vii) To create networking opportunities for key stakeholders in the African urban transport development chain.

SUMConference25 will spotlight key issues such as sustainable mobility plans & programs, mobility innovations, active mobility, public road safety, climate change, air quality monitoring & evaluation, freight & logistics, green transport, renewable energy sources, carbon finance, climate funding, bankable projects, intelligent transport systems (ITS), etc. For seamless communication at SUMConference25, there is provision for bi-lingual (English/French) translation facilities. Interested key stakeholders are also exhibiting their products and services throughout the 3-day event. The SUMConference25 program schedule comprises a hybrid of plenary and parallel breakout technical sessions.

I wish all SUMConference25 participants a highly impactful and transformative experience in sustainable urban mobility.
